



**New Orleans Track Club
2023 Hall of Fame Nomination Form**

Selection to the Hall Of Fame (HOF) is based on contributions to NOLA area running and to the success of the NOTC, and/or athletic achievements in NOTC races. To be eligible for nomination, a person must have been a member of the club for a total of at least twelve years. The selection committee may vote to waive this requirement for a nominee by a unanimous vote. Posthumous nominations are permissible.

Club members making nominations bear the responsibility of documenting the evidence that they believe justify the inclusion of the nominee into the HOF. This should be written documentation.

Nominations are automatically carried over from year to year for a period of three years.

The attached form should be used to make nominations.

While brevity is to be encouraged, please include all specific information that you believe might be useful to the committee in making a decision. You do not have to document every statement, but it is important to include specific contributions and achievements, including the years that these occurred.

You must be a current NOTC member to make a nomination.
